Message From the Principal

What a great school year all around! From top to bottom, the 2024 - 2025 school year was a resounding success. I saw so much social/emotional and academic growth from our students and am looking forward to building on that success as we prepare for the 2025 - 2026 school year. For me, planning for the next school year always begins around the midpoint of the current school year in January and lasts until the day before school starts. Part of this planning is reviewing the data from each year's Parent Feedback Survey. I always hope for openness and transparency in the answers to these surveys, and I appreciate the time you take to complete them. I've had some time to review the data and responses and wanted to share some insight with the school community. As always, this survey has various opinions, desires, and views. **I have attached the quantitative data from this survey at the end of this newsletter.** I want to focus on a few areas and extrapolate the information you may see from the data.

I like to take the top three or four areas of concern/desire/questions (provided from hard data and commentary) that consistently come up on the survey. These become areas for me to consider addressing or following up on moving into the next school year. I may be able to address them to various degrees; some I have been aware of and have already been looking at ways to address. In no particular order:

- **Turnover of staff/lack of staffing stability:** For the second consecutive year, there was a lot of feedback surrounding a relatively large amount of faculty and staff turnover over the past few years. I concur with this assessment as I've seen more turnover in the past two years than ever at St. Rose Catholic School. This turnover can be due to various reasons, with a portion being school-related and a portion being employee-related. During the 2022 - 2023 and 2023 - 2024 school years, I let some employees go, as I felt it was best for the students and staff, while others moved on for perceived greener pastures or left the profession entirely.

There are various reasons for employees to leave; however, in complete transparency, St. Rose Catholic School employees make less money than they would in working for any of the other local school districts. I believe that most people work at St. Rose Catholic School as they see education as a vocation and believe in the school's purpose; I also understand that the cost of living is going up, and people have expenses to pay. I strive to keep a stable staff; it benefits everyone, and I know that the faculty and staff are the pillars of St. Rose Catholic School. **I am continually grateful and appreciative for those families who constantly support my faculty and staff and our PTO and SAC Boards, who work tirelessly to support the teachers.** Fortunately, we have relatively little turnover heading into the 2025 - 2026 school year, as I needed to hire only two faculty/staff members who were not already on our payroll!

- **Finances:** This segment could be broken down into two sections: where the money collected from tuition and fees goes and the concern over the rising cost of education. As our fiscal year ends on June 30, 2025, I'd like to take a moment to share a brief summary of the operational vitality of St. Rose Catholic School.

Like all non-profit organizations, Saint Rose Catholic School seeks to achieve two financial goals yearly. The first is to ensure that our expenses (75% of which are salaries and benefits) do not exceed our revenue (90% of which is from tuition and fees). As has been the case for many years, our expenses exceeded our tuition revenue this fiscal year. I'm pleased to report that we have managed our finances prudently, ensuring the stability and growth of our school. Thanks to the generosity of the Saint Rose Community, we could cover the deficit with fundraising. These additional funds also allowed us to maintain or add additional programming such as elementary specials, 1:1 Chromebooks in grades 4 - 8, iPads in grades K - 3, and building and grounds projects such as the 2021 playground asphalt project, the awnings over the lunch tables, expansion of the preschool playground, and additional fencing put around the perimeter of the school. Thank you to every one of you who was able to support us. A special thanks to our incredible auction committee, amazing PTO, and other community members who led fundraising efforts this year.

As we look to the fiscal year ahead, we will invest in five percent increases in teacher salaries. Approximately half of the increases are needed to keep up with inflation, while the other half is part of our multi-year plan (more on this below) to invest in closing the salary gap with neighboring schools (more on this below). This essential investment will be combined with some substantial increases outside our control. They include a 12% increase in benefits (managed by the Diocese) and a 13% increase in General Liability insurance (also managed by the Diocese). These expense increases drive our tuition increases.

The second goal is to avoid debt, build our cash reserves to keep annual tuition increases at or below 5% and manage unexpected revenue or expense fluctuations. The Diocese has advised us that our Cash Reserve goal should be our average monthly expenses for five months. I am pleased to share that we currently have a little more than six months on hand and are not currently carrying any debt. **Our resources beyond the five-month reserve will be invested in three critical areas: our teachers, staff, and facility.**

For us to become a truly exceptional school, we must be able to compete in salaries and benefits with other area schools (public and private). Given our current financial situation, the current gap is substantial and can't be closed overnight. Each year, we will assess our cash reserve and the average salaries in the market and determine how much more investment in teacher salaries (beyond that needed to keep pace with inflation) is possible. **As leader of this school, recruiting and retaining great teachers and staff is of my highest priority.**

Following closely behind my commitment to investing in our teachers and staff is my commitment to prudently improving the facility. These improvements fall into two buckets - have-to-do's and nice-to-haves. In both areas, we are working very hard, through partnerships with the Church, community outreach, and grant applications, to minimize the financial burden on the school and maintain the five-month reserve fund. **I am grateful to the efforts of community members like Craig Bonelli, Stephanie Cadwallader, Chris Tracy, Tristan Riva, Jeremy Westerling, and Brian Sturgeon for their support and guidance in this.**

In the Fall of 2025, I will publish a financial report that will outline the 2025 - 2026 preliminary budget (due to the Diocese of Monterey on September 1, 2025) as well as a report showing our 2024 - 2025 actual budget as our fiscal year ends on June 30, 2025. In the meantime, you can view the numbers and projections below from our 2024 - 2025 projected budget submitted to the Diocese on September 1, 2024.

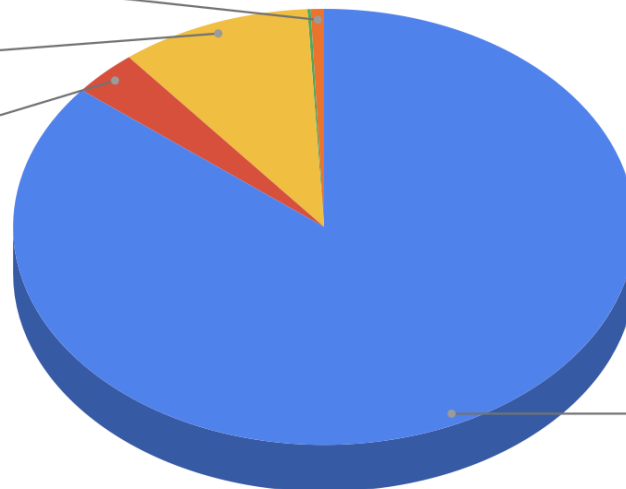

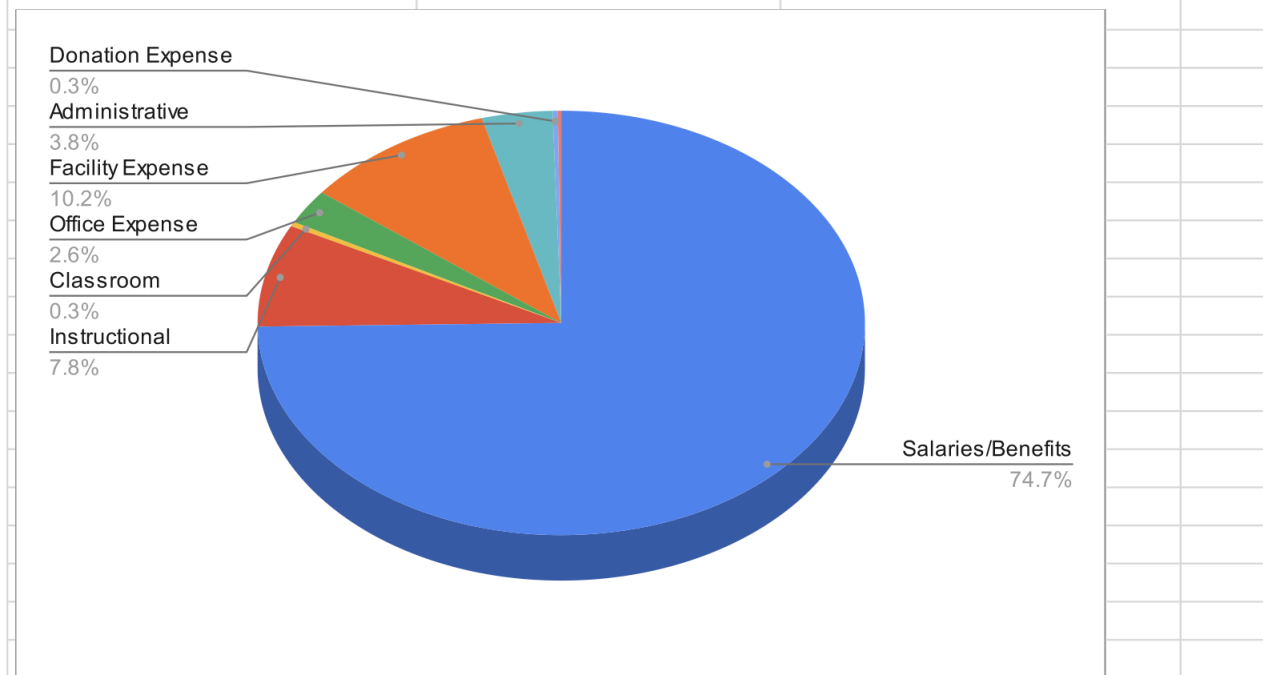

Expenses

- **Consistency of communication: Much like finances, the points about communication fit into a few subcategories: communications from the school/faculty/social media and frequency of communications.**

School/Admin: This is a tough one for me to decipher and wrap my head around as there were so many opinions, statements, and desires on this, and oftentimes, they opposed one another. **I received nearly equal amounts of feedback that there is not enough communication, just the right amount of communication, and too much communication coming from the office/administration. Similarly, along these lines, there was feedback that there is insufficient communication, and we (parents) don't know what is happening. There is too much communication, and we often don't read it as it is overwhelming.** In my opinion, I feel that I frequently over communicate, and I know that I tend to be wordy. As I write this lengthy newsletter, I'll try to work on condensing some items down (pretty hard to believe that I did whittle this down 🙄).

I received feedback from the faculty/staff communications that some faculty members are more consistent with timeliness, and some communication seems more/less thorough than others. This assessment makes sense as everyone has a unique style of communication. However, **I request that all communications be responded to promptly (within 24 hours on business days) and as thoroughly as possible. Clear, consistent communication often makes everyone's job easier, including the families.**

We received much positive feedback on our Instagram communications/page regarding social media. Since we hired a content manager, I have seen a visible improvement in our social media content. The concern/questions around social media primarily dealt with those without Instagram and potentially missing some information. **Fortunately, the salient content on Instagram is also communicated through the office or in newsletter format. Most of our online presence is photo/video content with children (hence why you rarely see pictures in my newsletters) and supplementing the information stream from the office.** If you do not have Instagram or follow the school, I recommend downloading the app and signing up. Follow our school if you are not a "social media type person." You'll receive the content and not feel that you have to keep up with everyone else constantly!

I was happy to see that many of you seemed optimistic regarding the three areas from last year's feedback survey that I focused on:

- **Staffing Stability:** 82.72% of 81 respondents were very satisfied or satisfied with progress made in this area. I would like to have as stable of a staff as possible as long as it is the right staff. I believe we are strongly moving in this direction and am incredibly optimistic about the team for next school year.
- **Support for the Sixth Grade Transition:** 100% of the 12 families of 6th-grade students who responded were optimistic about the direction taken this year. The elementary school to middle school jump is often the most challenging transition I see in school, and I am pleased with this year's success. I look forward to continuing to evolve and grow this year and helping our incoming sixth-grade students navigate middle school while not sacrificing their academic commitment.
- **Academic Support for Struggling Students:** We are committed to providing the best educational support for our students. I'm pleased that many of you are satisfied with our efforts. 83.1% of 71 respondents were very satisfied or satisfied with the continued support for struggling students, while 4.23% were dissatisfied. 12.68% of respondents wrote a narrative about this subject, which was generally positive. We will continue working with our struggling students on SMART goal planning and will work to add these goals for students who need additional challenges above grade level. Your child's academic success is our priority, and we're here to support them every step of the way.

New Items/Upcoming Events

2025 - 2026 School Year Staffing Updated Information: As I firm up staffing for the 2025 - 2026 school year, I want to take the time to communicate some changes that will apply to the next school year:

- **First-Grade Teacher, Ms. Gil:** I'm pleased to announce Ms. Bethany Gil will join our faculty and stabilize the first-grade position. Ms. Gil has eight years of experience teaching both Kindergarten and Second Grade in the public school system and is thrilled to be transitioning to the parochial school system. Some of you may recognize the name as Ms. Gil, and her husband, Matt, currently have a child, Bearett, in our Pre-K/TK classroom. A note from Ms. Gil:

My name is Bethany Gil, I am excited for the upcoming school year as the new 1st grade teacher. This will be my 9th year in education. I spent seven years teaching kindergarten and one in second grade. I am passionate about supporting students as they grow academically and socially and I look forward to building a welcoming and engaging classroom rooted in community. As a parent

myself-my son is an upcoming kindergartener- I am excited to share in this experience professionally and personally. I grew up in South Monterey County and attended a small K-8 school. I truly value the strong, supportive environment St. Rose offers. I look forward to meeting you in the coming school year.

- **Elementary Aide/Librarian:** Ms. Nino, our long-term substitute teacher in first grade since the midpoint of the school year, will be assuming the role of elementary aide and librarian for the upcoming school year. Ms. Nino has been involved with the school as a parent and a substitute teacher for many years and is excited to be permanently on the St. Rose Catholic School staff.
- **Middle School Science: Unfortunately, earlier this week, Ms. Bass informed me that she would have to resign for personal reasons. Ms. Bass has been a valued faculty member and would be welcomed back with open arms if she wants to return to teaching. As such, I am looking for a new part-time middle school science teacher who may be able to be in a full-time position, depending on their abilities. You can find the posting [here](#).**

It will also be time to say goodbye to two faculty members, as Ms. Donati and Ms. Emily Ezzo will be moving on. I thank both of them for their time and contributions at St. Rose. While this was Ms. Donati's first year at St. Rose Catholic School, she had spent many years working in the Diocese of Monterey. Ms. Ezzo has spent many years at St. Rose as a student, parent, and employee. It is impossible to quantify your contributions to the children of St. Rose Catholic School and the value added to our staff. You will be missed; thank you for your dedication and hard work!

Building and Grounds: As noted above, basic facilities expenses account for nearly 10% of our yearly operating budget. Some items, such as major projects or renovations, are not included in these expenditures. We do have some work on tap in the near future:

- **Windows:** Last summer was a busy time around the facility as a new roof (a great thank you to the St. Rose of Lima Parish) was installed on the school, Parish Office, and Parish Hall. We also had ballistic-rated windows installed in the classrooms facing the parking lot. This year, we received another CalOES (California Governor's Office of Emergency Services) Grant for \$197,500.00. This will cover about 80% of the cost of new windows in the remaining four classrooms and office building windows. I hope to complete this project during the 2025 - 2026 school year, as the process is slow and drawn out.
- **Centegix Crisis Alert System:** The safety and security of our students, faculty, and staff is not just a priority but an urgent concern. With safety incidents in U.S. K-12 schools rising, we must take proactive steps to ensure that our school is prepared for everyday emergencies and extreme situations. Earlier this spring, a Centegix representative visited our school and presented the program's benefits. Two weeks ago, St. Rose Catholic School representatives met with Paso Robles Police and Fire Departments, and they gave full support and blessing to this project as it will integrate with their systems.

After thorough research and careful consideration, I am pleased to announce that St. Rose Catholic School will implement [CrisisAlert by CENTEGIX](#). This proven solution enhances emergency response capabilities and creates a safer environment for everyone on our campus. To secure this system for the long term, we have signed a five-year agreement with CENTEGIX. I aim to have CrisisAlert fully operational by the midpoint of the 2025-2026 school year, with installation planned over the summer.

To fund the first year of implementation, I will appeal to the school community as I will need our school's and community's financial support. The cost for year one is \$21,000 (includes one-time fees like installation, implementation, and training, as well as the annual platform cost),

and we invite your participation in helping us reach this goal. Beginning in year two, the cost of maintaining the system will be included as a line item in tuition (approximately \$60 per family per year). Your involvement is essential and integral in making this a reality.

- **Courtyard:** During the 2023 - 2024 auction, we had a principal's fund drive for renovating the courtyard, including synthetic lawn, benches, and planters around the trees. This project has been on a holding pattern as we are exploring a larger plumbing project, which would necessitate the, you guessed it, tearing up of the courtyard. The money raised during the principal's drive is restricted and has been set aside until this project can come to fruition.
- **Preschool and Kindergarten Classroom Renovation:** This summer, we will continue the process of renovating classrooms with the "old" preschool classroom and kindergarten room on tap for this summer. This renovation will include new flooring, painting the classrooms, scraping the popcorn ceiling in kindergarten, and replacing the old lighting with new LED lighting.

Impressive Data from Ms. Davis: Most middle school students and families know that Ms. Davis (Middle School ELA/Literature) loves data. I'd like to share some impressive data from her classes this year.

"As many of you are aware, I enjoy analyzing and utilizing data to inform instruction. Here is some impressive data from this year's language arts and literature programs that supports just how well prepared our graduates are for high school and beyond.

Using IXL diagnostic data, which includes reading comprehension, grammar, vocabulary, and writing strategies, our 8th graders, on average, are performing at the 10th grade level, with many scoring "past high school"!

Our STAR data is even more impressive. As a school 78% of our students 1st - 8th grade are scoring above the 50th percentile. This baseline is designed to have half of a group of students above the baseline and half below. St. Rose has 78% of its students above! In the 8th grade, 100% of the class is above the baseline, with a class average percentile at 88% and an average reading level of 12.8, meaning 12th grade, eighth month!

In the Seventh grade, their average reading on STAR is 11th grade, third month and their IXL language arts score is 9.26 or ninth grade second month. In this class the STAR results indicate that 90% are above California's baseline and showed a 110 point growth on IXL this year. The IXL growth is impressive since they are averaging well above grade level.

In addition, we had several award winning authors. A seventh grader won the DAR district award for her creative essay. Also, this year we had two students win the California-Hawaii division for the Elks Americanism and Drug Awareness essays. Recognition at this level is exciting!"

Way to go Ms. Davis and our middle school students. Accolades are deserved all around!

Thank you for placing your trust in my team and me for your child's education. Your partnership helps to make St. Rose Catholic School a truly exceptional place.

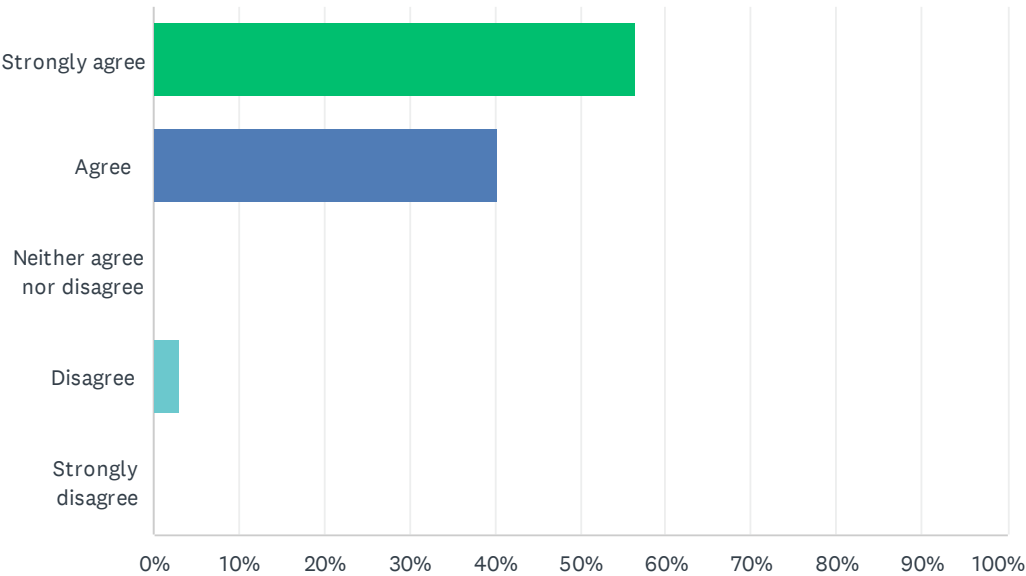

Q2 St. Rose offers appropriate and challenging academic programs.

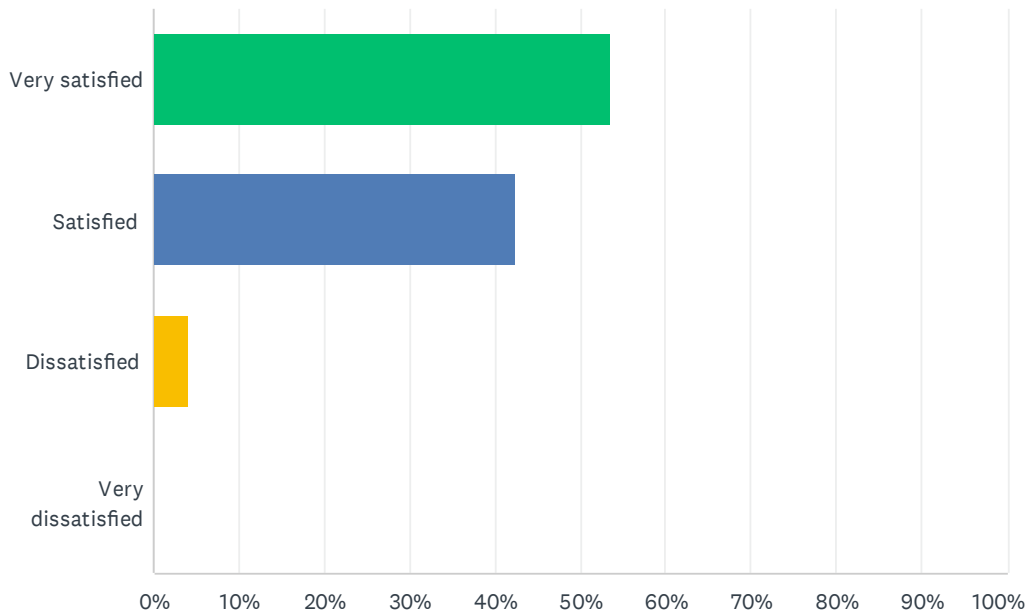

Q3 St. Rose has clearly communicated academic expectations.

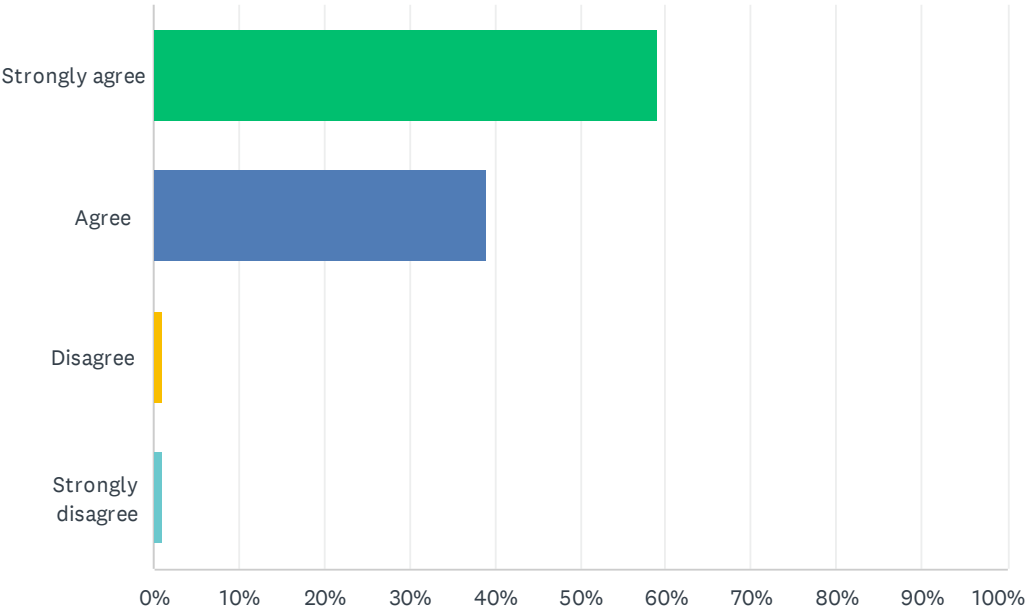

Q4 St. Rose teachers engage my child(ren) daily in the educational process.

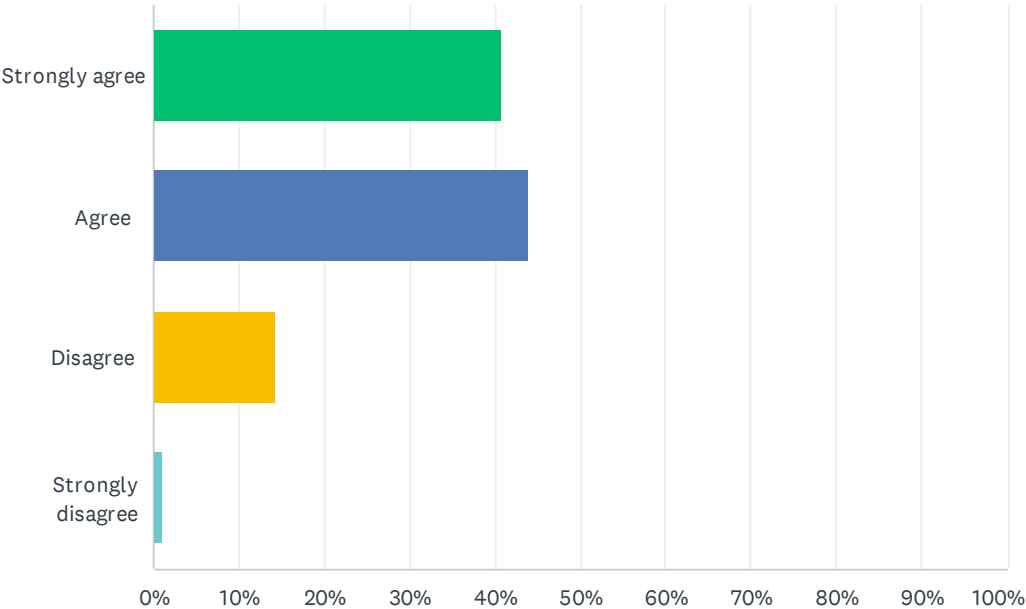

Q5 My child(s) teacher(s) tailor their teaching to help match my child(s) learning styles.

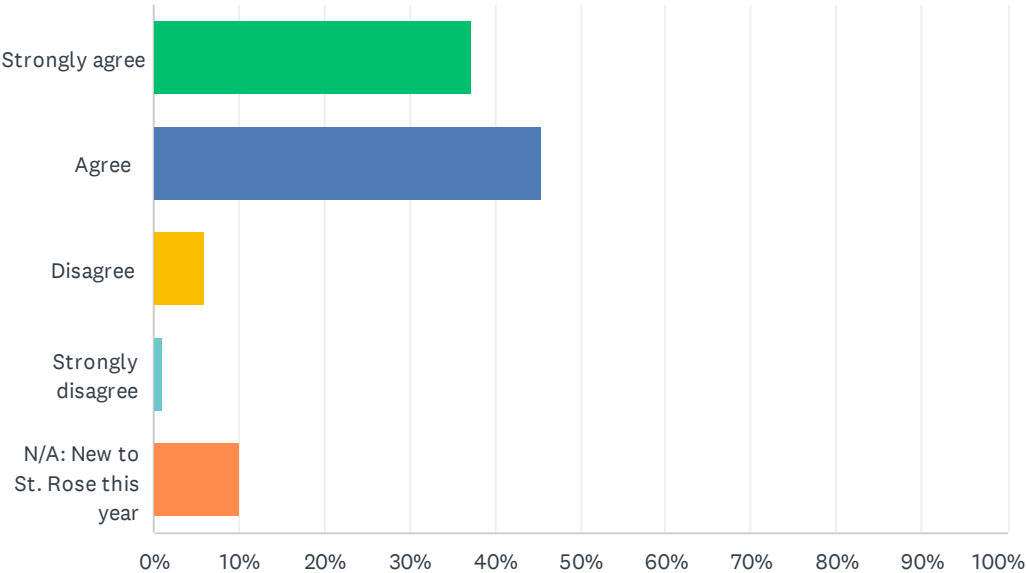

Q6 My child(ren) have experienced smooth transitions between grade levels.

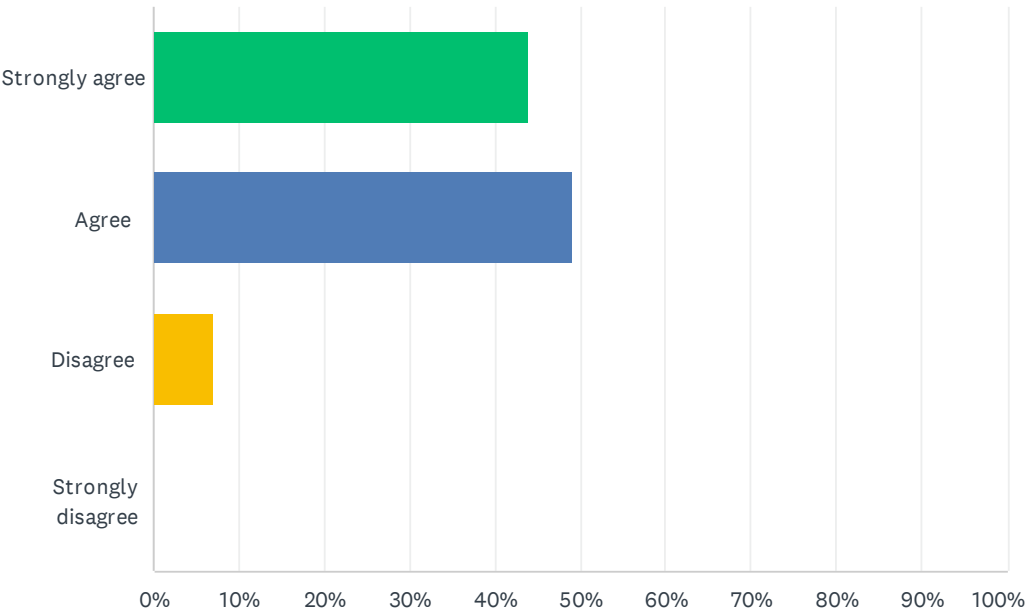

Q7 The academic programs meet my expectations.

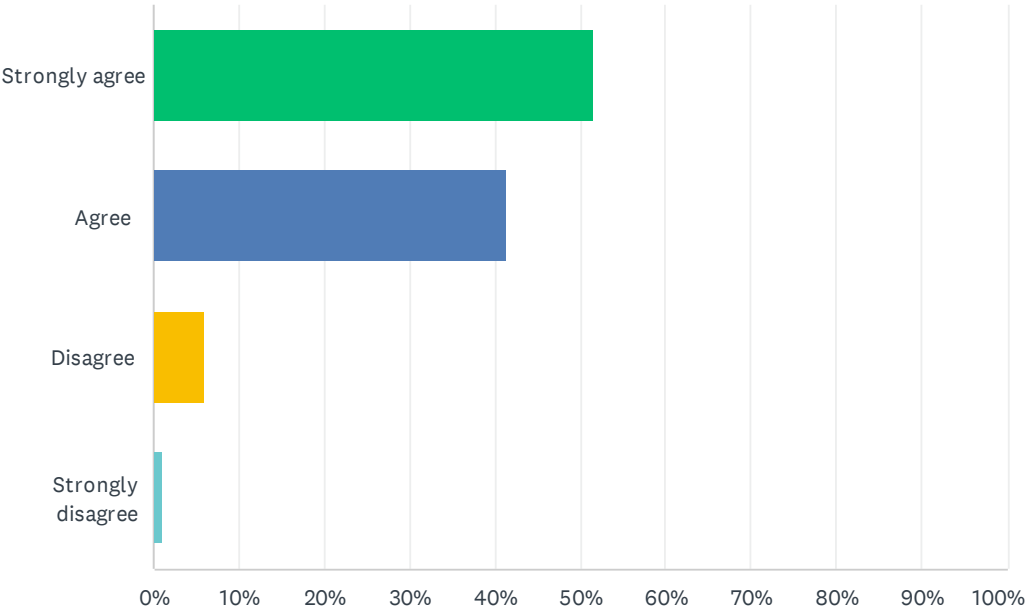

Q8 I feel that my child(ren)'s teacher(s) are preparing my child(ren) well for their next academic year.

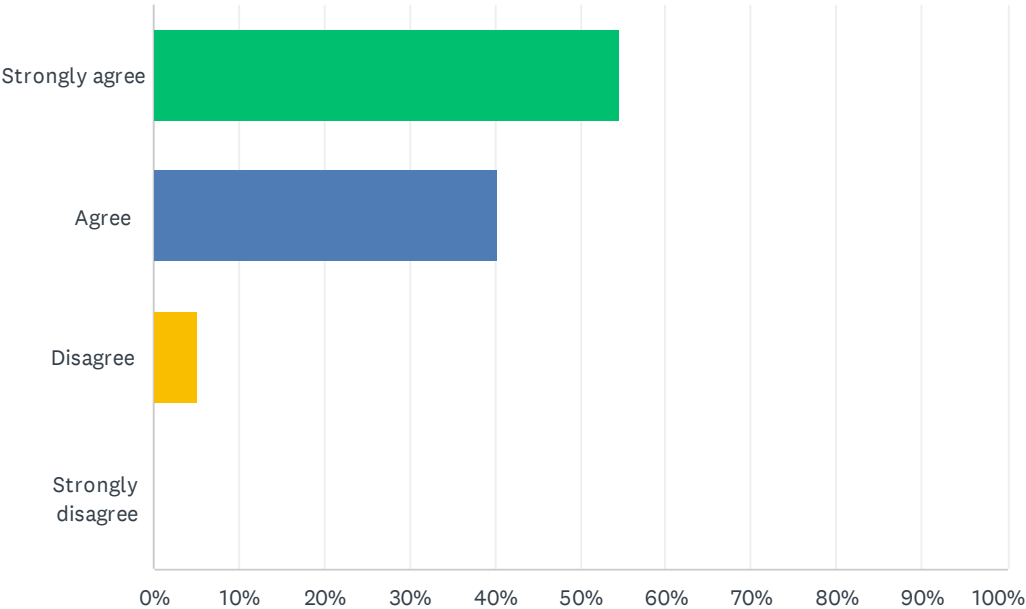

Q9 St. Rose Catholic School administration creates a school environment that helps my child(ren) learn.

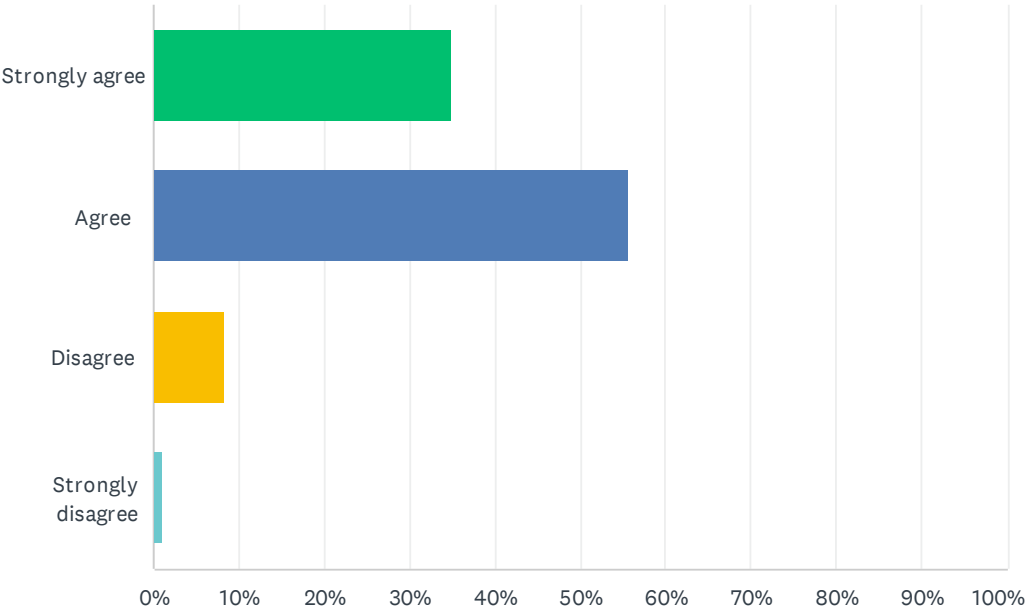

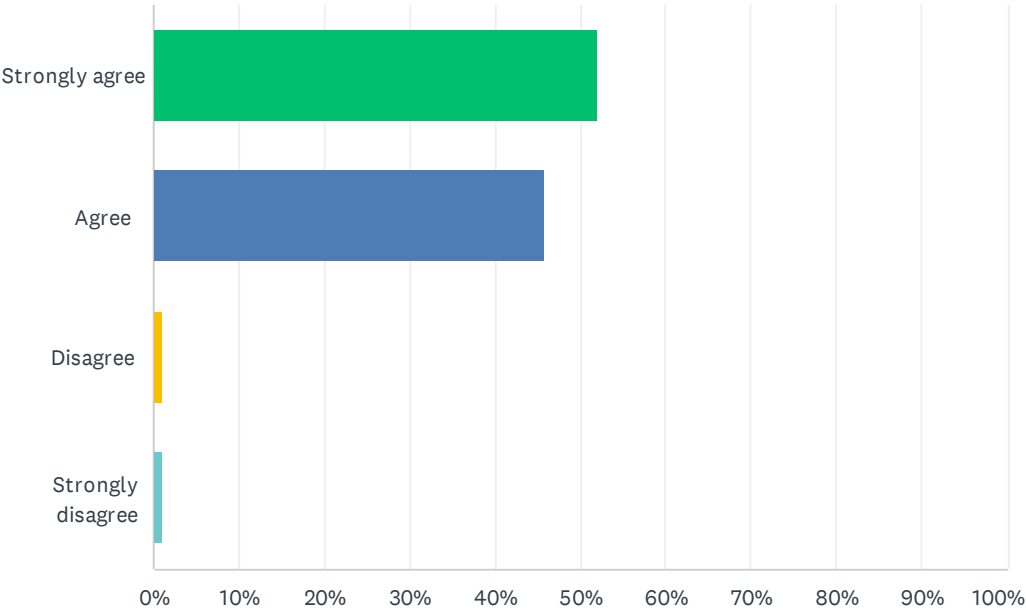

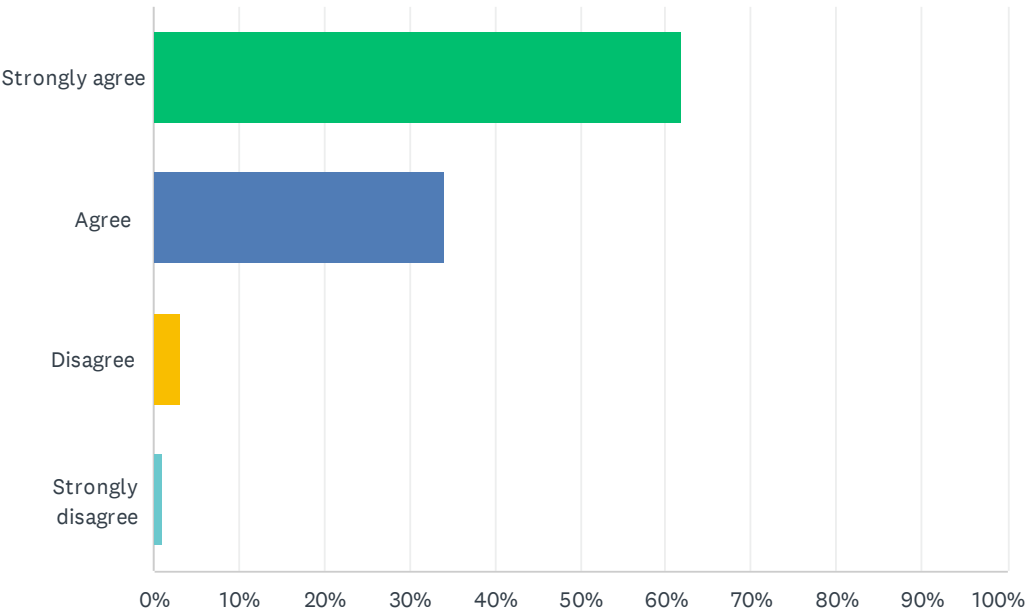

Q13 My child(ren) has a good relationship with his/her teacher(s).

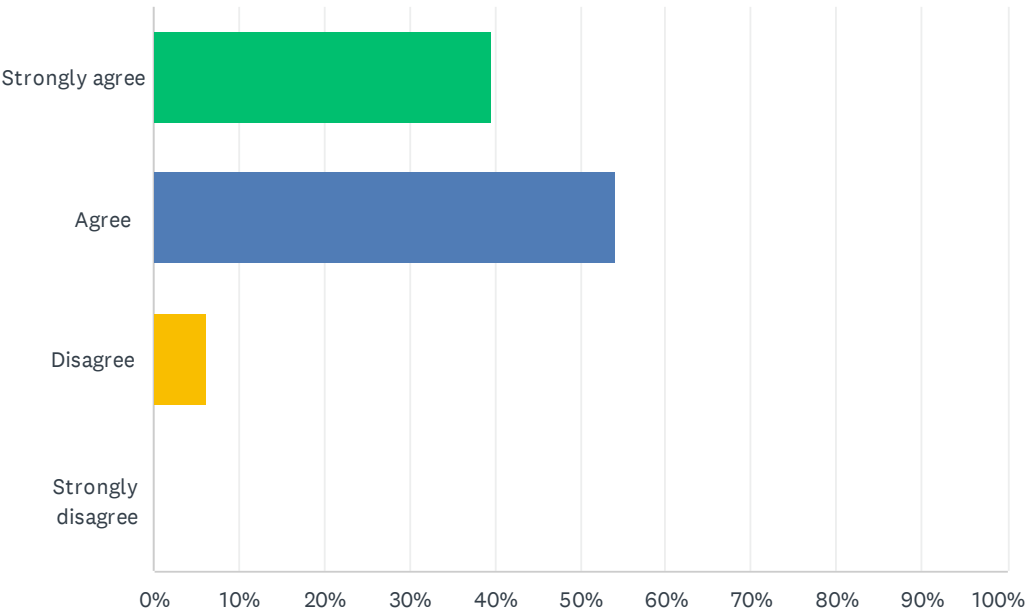

Q14 My child(ren) feels respected by his/her peers.

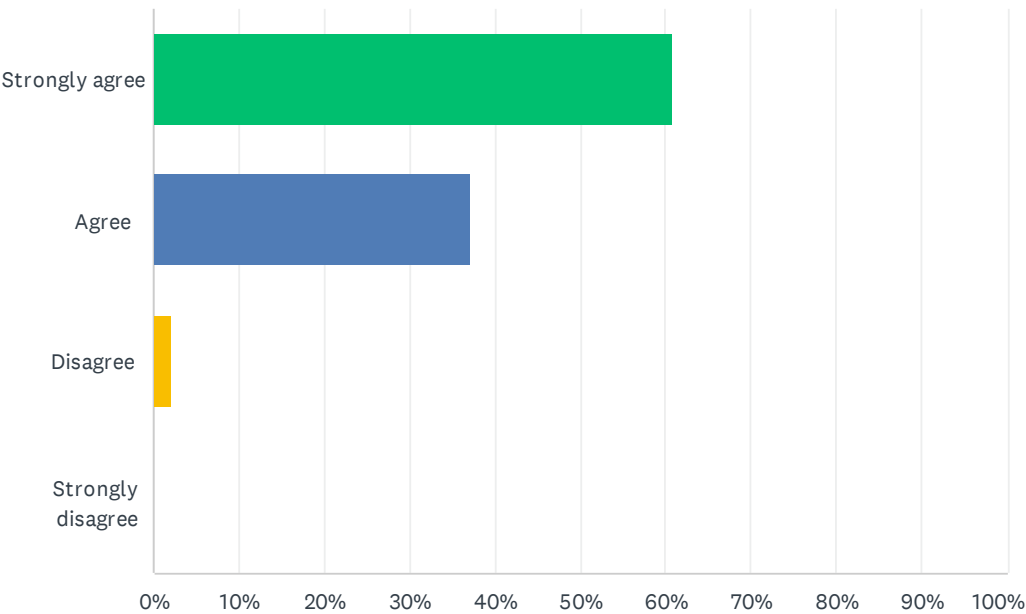

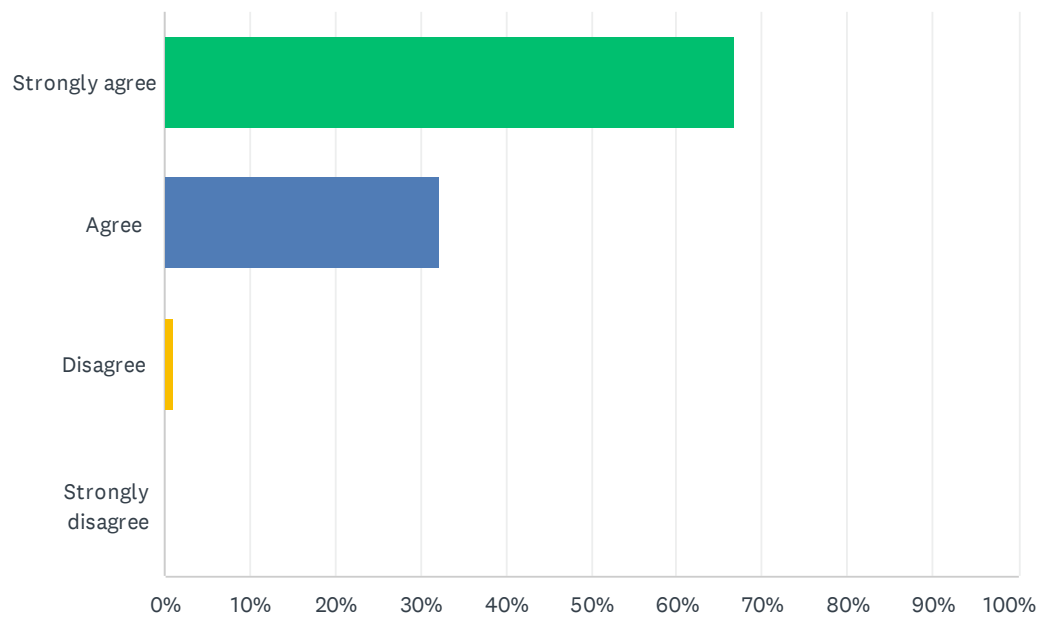

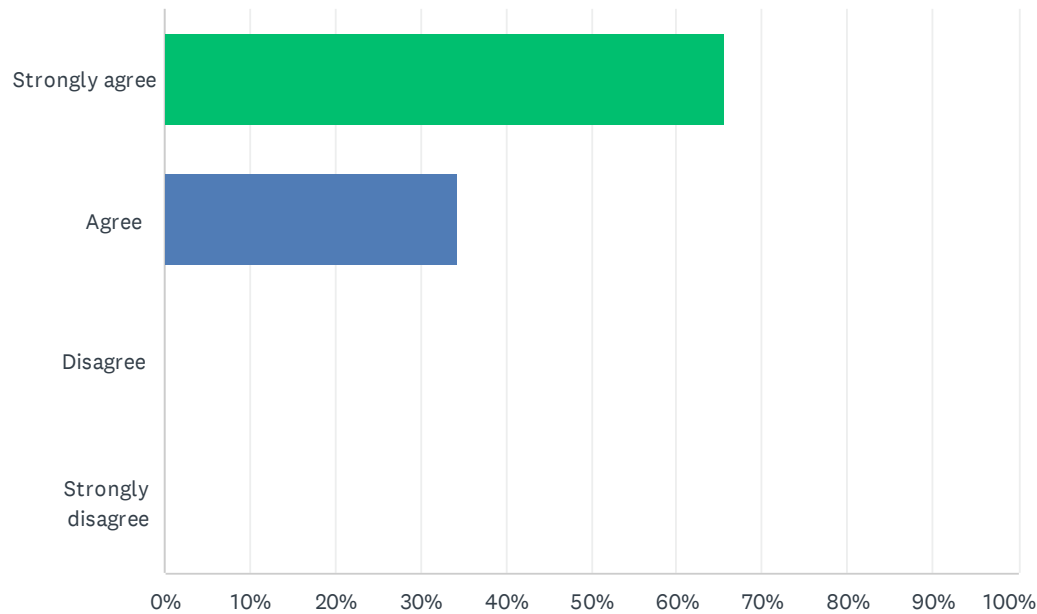

Q18 Family values are reinforced at St. Rose.

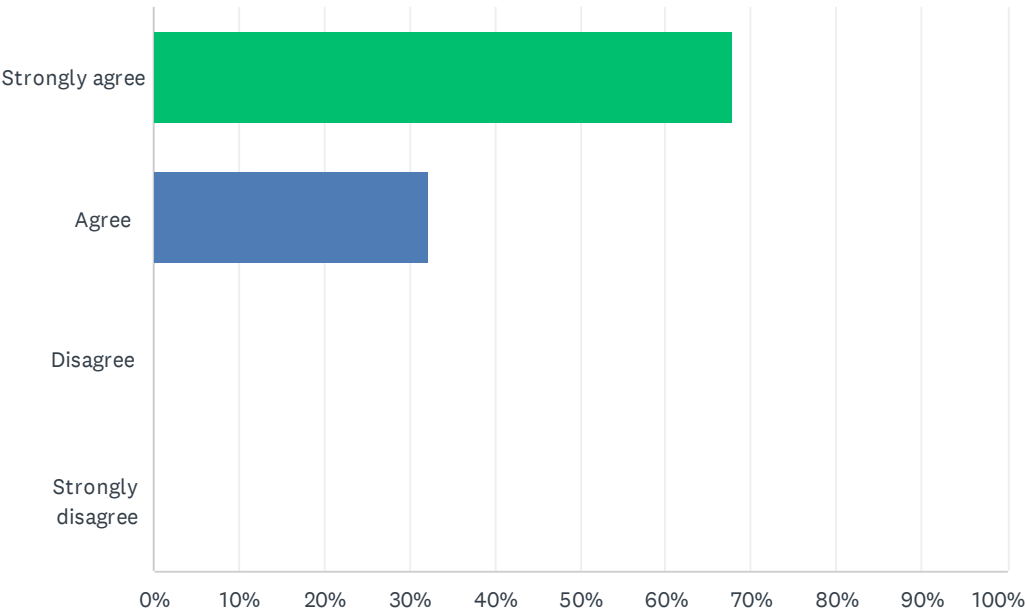

Q19 St. Rose offers a strong sense of Catholic identity.

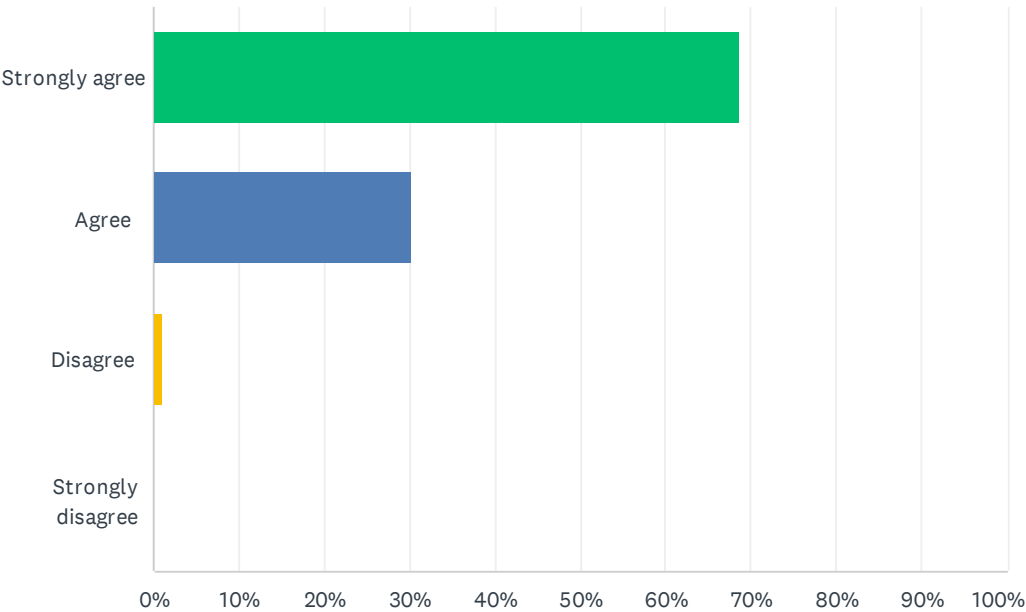

Q20 St. Rose offers sufficient worship and prayer opportunities.

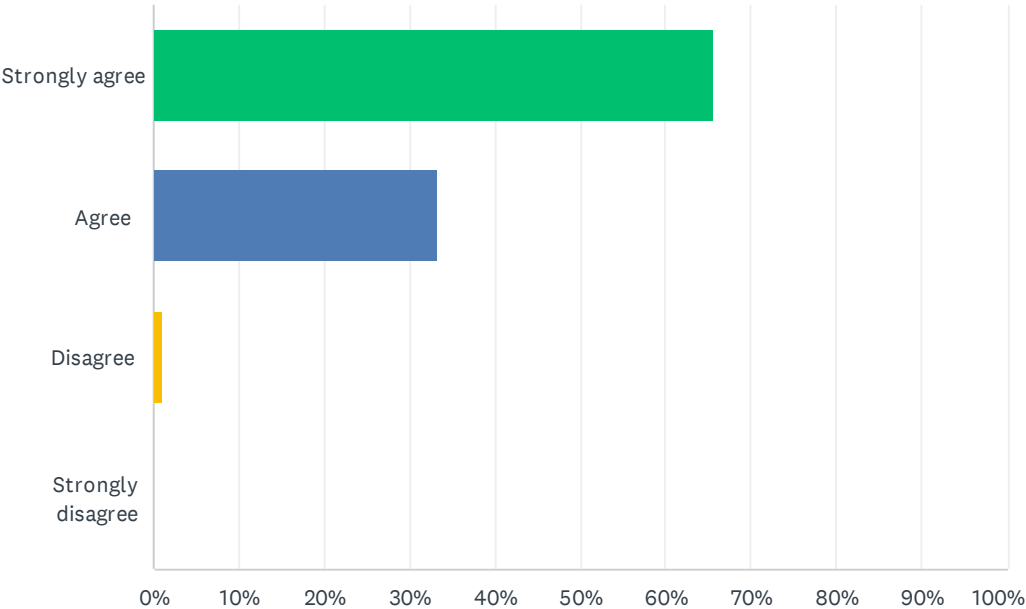
