## **Message From the Principal**

Part of the reason why I enjoy working in education is because no two days are alike, and nearly every day brings something new. Something new could be in the form of a student saying or doing something funny or out of character, seeing a student have one of those moments when they finally "get it", or a moment of friendship and camaraderie with my staff or parents of our community. However, some portions of the job become redundant, and we do these every year. With the beginning of the 3rd quarter on January 24, it is that time for parents to begin making decisions on registration for the 2022 - 2023 school year.

My staff and I are honored that you all have placed your children's education and safety in the St. Rose Catholic School staff's hands. As of this writing, half of our classes are at their maximum capacity with waitlists for the 2022 - 2023 school year. **Due to demand and budgeting purposes, families of current students planning on enrolling for the upcoming school year must register during the "Returning" student enrollment period as I cannot guarantee a spot after the "returning" student enrollment period ends.** Additionally, early enrollment allows us to budget for the upcoming school year properly. **Please see below for information on registration, dates and timelines, and 2022 - 2023 Tuition and Fees:** 

- Registration Information: Registration for the 2022 2023 school year will continue to be done electronically through your FACTS Family Portal. You will receive an email invite from Michelle Machado letting you know that registration is open, and you may register your child(ren). All currently enrolled students are guaranteed a spot for the 2022 2023 school year, provided they are registered during the "Returning St. Rose Catholic Student" enrollment period.
  - I know that many of you are concerned about the potential of a "vaccine mandate" for children to be able to attend school, and some of you have stated that you will likely choose to homeschool your children if this comes to fruition. Due to the uncertainty and the lack of clarity on what may or may not happen, I have added a caveat to the registration this year: If a family registers and the vaccine mandate does happen, and the family decides to *homeschool* their children, we WILL refund their registration fees. I do not want to see anybody not register and potentially lose their spot in a class due to fear of not being reimbursed. While registration fees ONLY if the mandate does happen and you decide to homeschool your children due to this mandate.
- **Dates and Timeline:** Registration will be broken down into tiers for both Preschool registration and K 8th-grade registration:
  - **Preschool Registration:** \$200.00 per student
    - Returning preschool students: February 7 18 (current students guaranteed a spot)
    - Siblings of currently enrolled Pre K through 8th-grade students: February 21 25
    - Open registration: February 28 March 11 (non-current students and families)
  - **K 8th Grade Registration:** Early registration rates of \$350.00 apply to all through March 18 and become \$400.00 on March 19
    - Returning currently enrolled Pre K through 7th-grade students: February 14 25 (current students guaranteed a spot)
    - Siblings of returning students: February 28 March 4 (brothers and sisters of current students who are not currently enrolled)
    - Open "Early" Registration: March 7 18 (non current families)
    - Regular Registration: March 19 June 30
- Tuition and Fees: Tuition for the upcoming school year will jump slightly with an increase of 4%. For grades K 8, this tuition increase amounts to \$258.00 (Parishioner rate) and \$243..00 (Non-Parishioner rate). Another way of looking at this is tuition increases, either \$1.35 or \$1.43 per day/student, based upon your child(ren) 's rate. For preschool students, this increase equates to roughly \$1.53 per day.

- Financial Assistance: Financial assistance is available to students in grades K 8 on a limited basis. Most monies allocated for assistance come from donations and our Scholarship Drive during our Dinner Auction. Financial aid is given on a need only basis and can be applied for through FACTS Management Company, which is linked to our website under <u>Tuition Assistance</u>. The application window is from February 7 March 18. The process is as follows:
  - Family applies through a third party, FACTS Management Company.
  - After reviewing the application and required documents (you will need to utilize your most recent tax information), FACTS will recommend that the applicant at St. Rose Catholic School of tuition assistance be awarded. (Assistance is based upon tuition only, not associated fees).
  - After reviewing FACTS recommendations and confirming monies received through the Scholarship Drive and donations for scholarships, we will send out letters of tuition awards in mid-April.

According to data received from our 2020 - 2021 Parent Satisfaction Survey, 127 of 128 respondents stated "Yes" to the question "Do you feel that the education received at St. Rose Catholic School is worth the tuition cost?"

# **New Items/Upcoming Events**

**Grades/Report Cards:** Our second quarter ended on January 21. Typically, teachers complete grades by the following Wednesday and report cards are digitally mailed out one week after the end of the quarter. **Due to the high numbers of student absences due to COVID protocols, I am pushing back the quarter two grading due dates from staff. As is the nature of the protocols, I cannot identify the date that we will send report cards home.** Please be patient with us in this matter, and they will come out in due time.

**26th Annual St. Rose Catholic School Dinner Auction:** As previously stated, due to the early January Diocesan protocols that prohibit large group gatherings due to the COVID 19 surge, we have had to move our live Dinner Auction from Friday, February 25 to a virtual Auction on Saturday, February 26. I'm sure that moving the auction to a virtual platform was disappointing news for many of you, myself included. However, due to the nature of the event being planned and run 100% by volunteers, the logistics included, and the uncertainty of when "large group gatherings" will once again be allowed, we felt that this was the best course of action. Those of you who "attended" last year's virtual auction saw that it can still be a fun event, and I encourage you to join pods or watch parties for this event. **For information about this event, please see our website.**

Monday	Mismatch	Student vs teacher trivia at flagpole Award for best mismatch class	Wear the craziest mismatch outfit. Please follow the school free dress code.
Tuesday	Pj and Crazy Hair Day	Movie with buddies	Wear your favorite pajamas with the craziest hair. Clothing should follow the dress code. Students will also watch a movie with their big/little buddies. Food will not be shared during this time.
Wednesday	Heroes or Villain		Dress up as your favorite hero or your favorite villain. You can also have a friend do it with you. Please remember to wear a proper Covid mask indoors. Costume masks will only be worn outside.

St. Rose Catholic School is up for re-accreditation in March of 2022. Technically, we were supposed to have had our accreditation visit in March of 2021; however, COVID put that on hold. What is "accreditation" you may ask? Accreditation is the process for evaluating and assuring the quality of educational institutions and programs.

WASC and WCEA accredit St. Rose Catholic School. WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges) is the accrediting body for the western region of the United States. WCEA (Western Catholic Education Association) aims to advance quality Catholic education for all students in member schools through an accreditation process that promotes faith formation, the rigor of educational excellence, and continuous school improvement. My staff has been working on our accreditation process and report for the past two and a half years and are looking forward to our accrediting team's visit and, hopefully, recertification of our accreditation for another six years.
