Message From the Principal

We are now two-thirds of the way done with the 2022 - 2023 school year. It is hard to remember if we've had a year with more "rainy day" schedules, especially following the early part of September when we had "rainy day schedules" due to heat and air quality. Regardless of the situation, I am always happy to see and hear from the children daily. This has been a challenging year for me, personally and professionally, and, at times, I felt tired, demoralized, and even questioned myself.

Recently I have had a string of people outside of our school community offer words of encouragement and remind me of how well our students behave, show respect, and conduct and carry themselves:

• A prospective family: during an intake interview for enrolling their child at St. Rose Catholic School for the 2022 - 2023 school year, when asked the question, "why St. Rose as opposed to other schools," they answered that it was due to their interactions with our

middle school students during the Harvest Festival. They said how much our middle school students helped their children and how attentive they were to our guests.

- The onsite director at NatureBridge Golden Gate: when our 6th-grade students were leaving their three-day, two-night field trip, the director pulled me aside and let me know that our 6th-grade students were among the top two or three most well-behaved groups they have had all year.
- A substitute teacher: a substitute teacher stated how impressed they were with the children and said our students were some of the best they've ever seen in 15-plus years in education. They went on to say that the children were always open to volunteering, said thank you and please, and always finished the Pledge of Allegiance with "May God Bless America."
- Last Friday, I was taking a dump trailer load of brush from the back of the schoolyard. I kindergarten student said, "Mr. K, why are you destroying God's creation?" I didn't know what to say and told him we were trimming the bushes to clean up the yard. He was adamant that I should not be destroying God's creation.

When I hear stories like this, I can refocus myself and know that we are helping parents enrich our students and provide them with a solid foundation to grow upon. However, we do have areas of growth that we are always looking to work on. Education and life constantly evolves, and being open to change and adjusting accordingly is essential.

Extended Care Sign Up: Thank you to those using our website's Sign Up Genius link to pre-register your children for extended care. It has been working well with most students pre-registered so that we don't go over a safe number of students daily. It worked so well that some have been signing children up, and we then have several "no-shows" holding up others from registering and holding spots that are not being used. Please remove your children's names by noon on the day they are signed up so that space opens up and we are not looking for a child. Beginning February 1, 2023, a \$25.00 "no show" fee will be added to your FACTS account for every third "no show" at extended care. Families can easily avoid this fee by removing their children's names from the list before noon if they are not attending extended care.

REGISTRATION FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE ST. ROSE CATHOLIC PRESCHOOL – JR. HIGH SCHOOL

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce you St. Rose of Lima Branch 354 of the Italian Catholic Federation. Many of you may be aware of our organization as a result of our sponsorship of the Semi-Annual Pasta Dinners at St. Rose of Lima's Church in Paso Robles.

The Italian Catholic Federation is much more than the Semi-annual pasta Dinners. In the Italian Catholic Federation we encourage and promote faith renewal, apostolic and charitable works as well as Catholic education. The ICF Branch 354 funds academic scholarships for graduating St. Rose 8th graders, local high school seniors entering their first year of college, and college student's continuing their education.

I would like to share with you a Student Registration Financial Assistance Program the ICF Branch 354 would like to implement at St. Rose Catholic Preschool – Jr. High School. For ICF families who have children attending St. Rose Catholic Preschool – Jr. High School to participate in this program you must be an active participating member of the ICF Branch 354. You do not have to be of Italian heritage to be a member of the ICF (my wife is Mexican American). One of the adults in the school family must be Catholic.

The monies dedicated to this Program will be raised from the new Fundraisers we sponsor each year. There is no "FINANCIAL MEANS" Test Stipulation to participate in this Registration Assistance Program. The only criteria are your family is an active participating member of the ICF Branch 354 and you have children attending St. Rose Catholic Preschool – Jr. High School. Those families who meet our criteria, who want to participate in this Registration Assistance Program, will share equally per student in the amount of monies dedicated to this program. For example, 10 students sharing \$1,000, each student would receive \$100 in registration assistance. The more successful our fundraising efforts for the program, the more money will be allocated per student.

ICF BRANCH 354 (PASO ROBLES) REGISTRATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- ➤ The purpose of the ICF Branch 354 Registration Assistance Program is to promote parochial Catholic education and encourage the goals and objectives of the ICF among Catholic families in our community.
- ➤ The registration assistance is limited to families who are active members of ICF Branch 354, Paso Robles.
- ➤ The families who participate in the ICF Branch 354 Registration Assistance Program must have their children enrolled in a parochial Catholic school, which requires an academic year pre-registration.
- ➤ The families who wish to participate in the ICF Branch 354 Registration Assistance Program must participate in fundraising activities of ICF Branch 354 and/or attend five (5) meetings.
- > The funds dedicated to this Registration Assistance Program are derived from identified fundraising activities.
- ➤ The Board of the ICF Branch 354 will determine the amount of Branch 354 funds disbursed to the Registration Assistance Program from the fundraising activities.
- ➤ The funds allocated to the Registration Assistance Program will be disbursed by dividing the funds by the number of children of active families participating in the Registration Assistance Program.
- ➤ The families in ICF Branch 354, who are interested in participating in the Registration Assistance Program, must contact the Branch 354 Treasuer.
- ➤ The disbursed funds will be sent to the schools involved in the name of the individual child of the family participating in the Registration Assistance Program by the Branch Treasurer.
