Message From the Principal

In the last couple of weeks, I have visited every classroom in the school to observe the teachers, guide potential families on tours, and observe how the children interact with one another. During my visits, I have noticed a few things that captured my attention.

I observed various activities in the different grade levels of a school. In the preschool classroom, children were sharing and taking turns on the slide while also learning about Lent. In kindergarten, students proudly showed me the flowers they were growing from seedlings and explained the different parts of the plant. A first-grade student discussed with me the perks of wearing a school uniform to a prospective kindergarten student. In second grade, I watched a math lesson on counting money in denominations of 5, 10, and 25. The students impressed me by correctly identifying the imprints on the back of the coins. In third grade, a student recited positive affirmations about themselves before their "self-affirmation station." The fourth-grade students worked together to create a class newspaper that included every student in one way or another. I've included this production at the end of my newsletter as a shout out to this hard working group of fourth grade students. In fifth grade, I observed a lesson on invasive and native species, during which the students asked great questions that showed they were becoming critical thinkers. The sixth-grade class was excited to leave for their first overnight field trip to the Marin Headlands just north of San Francisco. In seventh grade, some students were caught spraying excessive deodorant in the bathroom after P.E. class. However, I was pleased and impressed with their honesty and willingness to learn from the experience. Finally, in eighth grade, I watched a social studies lesson on American history, during which the students showed a strong desire to gain knowledge and understanding of our government and history.

Regardless of each day's uncertainties, it is evident that many good things are going on at school daily!

New Items/Upcoming Events

Wine Country Run (WCR): Have you ever heard of the Wine Country Half Marathon and 10K? Perhaps you're not aware that **70% of the proceeds from this event are directed towards supporting Athletics and Athletic Facilities at St. Rose Catholic School.** Although it is not a school event, it was initiated by two St. Rose Catholic School parents in the late 1990s and has been organized by SRS parent volunteers. This helps to ensure that most of the proceeds go directly back to our school.

The funds raised have been used to buy middle school athletic uniforms and upgrade the Parish Hall athletic facilities by providing a new scoreboard, floor, retractable basketball hoops, and volleyball system. They have also added playground structures such as the primary playground slide structure, soccer goalposts, and preschool playground structure. In addition, the proceeds have provided a \$2,500.00 per year Physical Education budget for playground equipment and supplies and offset the cost of more extensive playground items such as the school blacktop, track, and baseball diamond.

These are just a few examples of how the WCR races have helped our students. In the past six races, we've received an average of \$17,666.00 for our school. **We're looking for new volunteers to take over organizing this event so we can continue to support our school.** Our current committee chairs have been leading this event for many years and are now ready to step back.

While some of the past volunteers have returned, we need a new team to take charge. If you and your friends are interested in chairing this event, let me know so we can discuss it. Our previous leadership team is willing to mentor and assist, but we need to find the right group to keep this fantastic donation coming toward our athletic program for the foreseeable future.

Middle School Coed Soccer: I am thrilled to announce that St. Rose Catholic School will be having a middle school coed soccer team for the first time. Mr. G. will be leading the team as the head coach this season, and we already have five schools on the schedule! You can come and watch the team play on our field for the home games scheduled for 3/14, 4/9, and 4/16 at 3:45. I am grateful to Coach Kellie for working so hard to make this happen and am looking forward to the possibility of adding some elementary after-school sports options in the 2024-2025 school year.





JACK'S RESTAURANT REVIEW



MATH IN FOURTH

Hello everybody! This is an article about Math and what we learn in our Fourth Grade. First, we learned about rounding. Rounding is changing a number to a more simple number. First, we look at a number such as 4,760. Let's say you want to round to the nearest hundreds. Then you would look at the place value that is one place less than the place value you picked, which in this case is the tens place. If that number is five or more, the digit to the right, which in this case is the hundreds place, adds one then makes all the numbers behind that number zero. If it's four or less, subtract one from the digit to the right then all the numbers behind that number are zeros. In this case the number in one place less than the place you picked is 6, and $6 > 5$ so the digit to the left will be one more and all numbers behind will be zeros, so 4760 rounded to the nearest hundreds place is 4800. This is a little note to help you: don't have to round to the nearest hundreds place every time

Next, we'll talk about how to multiply a two digit number by a one digit number. Let's say you wanted to find 24 times 3. First, multiply the one's place. $4 \times 3 = 12$. Then put the number in the one's place in the product, put the number in the tens place on top of the two digit number you had, which in this case is 24 and put it over the 2. Then, multiply the tens place and the one digit number which is this case is two and three $2 \times 3 = 6$. If you have any numbers on the top, in this problem we have $6 + 1 = 7$. Then put that in the tens place. So $24 \times 3 = 72$.


Now let's talk about how to multiply a 2 by 2 digit number. Let's say you wanted to multiply 21 times 16 first multiply in the ones place. In this case we have one times six (1×6) which equals 6. Then put the six down in the product. We don't have anything to put in the tens place, so we move on. Next, we multiply the tens place (the number at the top) from the ones place (the number at the bottom). We have a 2 and a 6 and $6 \times 2 = 12$ put that number in the product. Next, add a zero to the bottom of the number you already had and at the moment is 126. Then, the top number multiplies the ones and the bottom number multiplies the tens and right now we have a one times one (1×1) which equals one. Put that next to the zero if the number was 10 or more we would regroup that to the tens place, at the moment we don't have to do that. Next, we multiply the tens place for both numbers. Right now we have a two and one, and $2 \times 1 = 2$. We then put that down right next to the number on the bottom. Finally, add the two numbers. We have 126 and 210, and $126 + 210 = 336$. So $21 \times 16 = 336$.

Now we will talk about how to do long division. We will try to figure out what 263 divided by 4 is. First, look at the number to the left. The number that fits in the divisor divides that number from the divisor. If not, look to the next number. Keep going until you can fit the number in this case it would be 26 then, figure out how many times the number fits 26 goes into 4 6 times. Next, multiply the divisor and the number of how many time it fits, in this case it we have a 4 and a 6 $4 \times 6 = 24$. Then, subtracting the product from the number you originally had in this case we have a 24 and a 26, $26 - 24 = 2$. Last bring down one number at a time if there isn't a number to bring down your ether done or there is a remainder we have a three to bring down repeat these steps until there is nothing to bring down. Note if all the numbers you have can not fit in the divisor it is 0 or it is 0 with a remainder.

Next we will talk about the order of operation. These is the order of operations parentheses, exponents, multiplication and division, and addition and subtraction. Exponents are too hard for some people, so we will skip that part. Lets say you wanted to find $2 \times (3 + 4)$. First, we see if there are parentheses if so we start with that if not, we move on. We do have parentheses so we start there, $4 + 3 = 7$ bring down everything you did not use. Next (seance we are skipping exponents) is multiplication and division, multiplication and division are on the same level so witch one is closest to the left you do first. Now back to the problem do we have multiplication or division, yes we do, we have a 2 and a 7. $2 \times 7 = 14$ there isn't anything left to do so $2 \times (3 + 4) = 14$. Note that addition and subtraction are on the same level.

This is what we have leared in 4th grade, I hope you leared a lot thank you for listening to our article, good bye America.


now the sport of the week is Soccer, also known as Futbol.
