2021 - 2022 School Year Updates: As stated in the April Newsletter, I will do my best to keep you up to date with any COVID related changes that go into effect for the 2021 - 2022 school year. Please remember, many changes/policies are at the discretion of the CDPH and their forthcoming guidelines for the 2021 - 2022 school year. What I do know/are likely to happen:

- Class sizes in K 8 will be capped at 28 students. This cap is up to 6 students per class as educational and social distancing requirements have gone down from 6 feet to 3 feet.
   My ideal class size would be between 25 28 students per room. I have no desire to pack 36 children in a classroom.
- Preschool daily class size will increase to 24 students per day, up from 20 students per day this school year.
- St. Rose Catholic School will offer Extended Care from 3:00 5:30 for grades K 8. As I believe there will still be some "cohorting" restrictions, this will likely be by sign up only as we will probably have to limit the number of children in extended care daily. Additionally, I see the ability to offer a full slate of middle school interscholastic athletics next school year. There will likely be COVID restrictions on the activities, but I do see the children being able to play.
- I am getting a pretty good feel on staffing next year; however, the one area that I have received little or no interest in is Spanish. I would much prefer to have a human teaching Spanish rather than a computer. If you or anyone you know is interested in this position, please click here to view the job description and requirements and/or apply for the position. Please feel free to share with those that you know may be interested. (Note, a BA/BS and teaching credential is required. The teaching credential does not need to be in Spanish.)
- BINGO: St. Rose Catholic School has run a BINGO program since before I began at the school. Unfortunately, I am "retiring" the program as school profits from the event have consistently decreased over the past ten years as the number of participants has decreased. At the same time, the amount of work and energy put into keeping the program running has remained the same or increased. The ratio of money received/hours worked doesn't make sense.
