Message From the Principal

It's hard to believe that, as of this writing, there are only 26 days left in the 2024 - 2025 school year. I'm blessed to be a part of the school after 27 years, and I look forward to year 28 next year. Knock on wood, but I'm not anticipating the need to hire any additional faculty or staff for the upcoming year as I have internally filled an aide position (as Maria Donati will be moving to Arizona over the summer) and have offered the vacant first-grade position to a capable veteran teacher who I am confident is the perfect fit for our school (once all clearance, etc. has been completed I will inform the community). For as long as I have been involved with St. Rose Catholic School, our middle school students have taken overnight field trips and been involved in interscholastic athletics.
